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1 Master Semantic Hierarchy

The Rule: Ensure H1, H2, and H3 tags reflect actual content structure, not just font sizes.

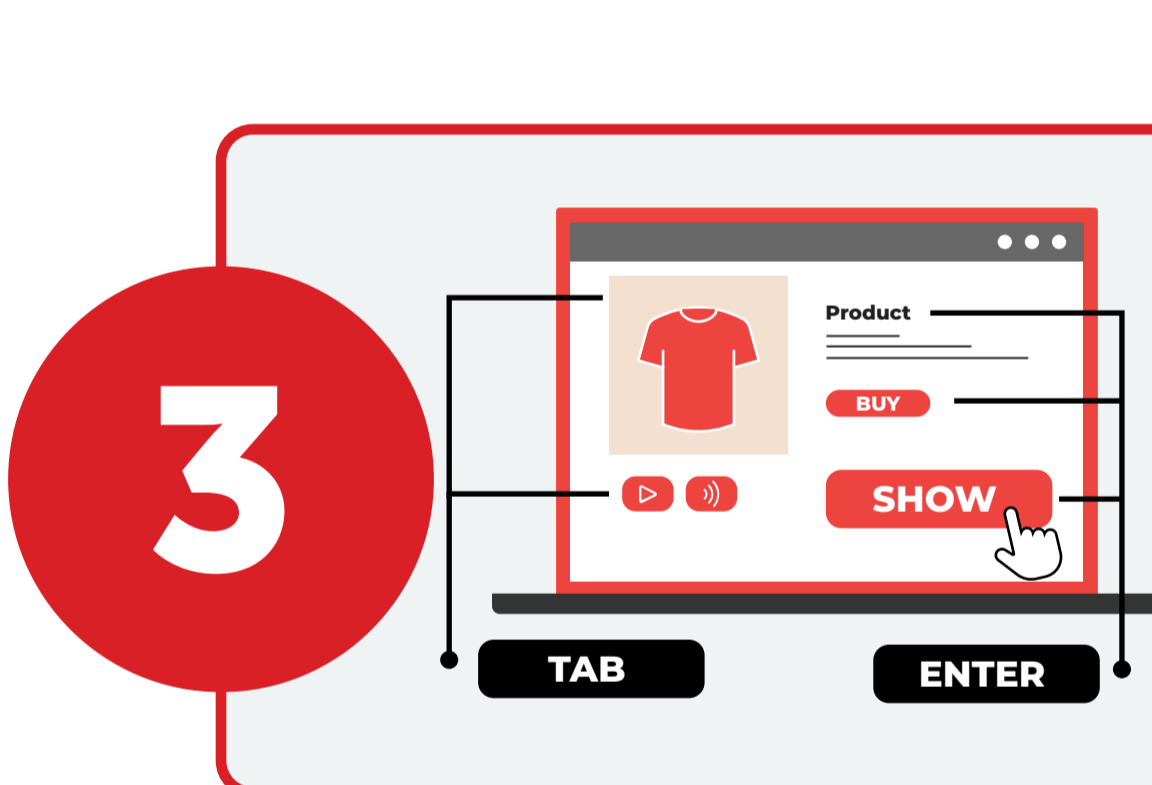
The Why: Proper nesting allows screen readers to navigate your site logically.

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2 Execute the Alt-Text Audit

The Rule: Move beyond basic descriptions to keyword-informed, descriptive image text.


The Why: Accessibility and SEO now overlap. Alt-text is essential for both screen readers and image search rankings.

Pro Tip: If an image is purely decorative, mark it as such to avoid cluttering the user experience.
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3 Pass the Keyboard Navigation Test

The Rule: Conduct a "Tab Key" audit. Can a user complete a full checkout or contact form without a mouse?

The Why: Many users rely on assistive switches or keyboards. If they can't "Tab" through, they can't buy.

Pro Tip: Watch for "Keyboard Traps" where a user gets stuck in a pop-up or menu.
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4 Upgrade Interactive Labels

The Rule: Replace generic "Click Here" buttons with descriptive labels like "Download the 2026 Compliance Guide."

The Why: Descriptive text provides vital context for users with visual or cognitive impairments.

Pro Tip: Meaningful labels improve your site's Click-Through Rate (CTR) and overall usability.
